

## REPORT OF ATTENDANCE TO BOURNEMOUTH AIRPORT CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE JULY 4<sup>TH</sup> 2019

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Item 1 Election of Chair & Deputy. Previous Members were proposed, accepted and elected.

Item 2 Apologies for Absence. Chair noted that due to various changes in membership not all members to the new committee had been appointed, as such current attendance was a bit sparse.

Item 3 Minutes of Last Meeting. Were accepted as a true record and signed.

Item 4 Matters Arising. None were raised.

Item 5 Airport Business Update. Was presented by Steve Gill MD. Aircraft and passenger movements are currently ahead of projected targets, Ryanair have introduced new 3 new routes, TUI 2 new, whilst Loganair are not getting projected business to Channel Isles at the moment. In all there are currently 4 Airline and 9 Tour Operators using the airport. Also of note the Baggage Handling has been taken in house with great success and passenger approval.

Item 6 Corporate & Social Responsibility. Was presented by Debbie Mitchell this covered Habitat Management two dates being mentioned when committee members could be given access to view progress in this area. Air Quality Monitoring, was reported as being maintained within required limits. Noise. The current readings and complaints from within the the Airport noise zone were consistently below accepted levels, with two non compliant incidents reported back to the companies concerned.

Item 7 Estates. The manager for the estate Harvey Greenman spoke about developments of the Business Park as well as the airport as a whole, planning applications were in place, one relating to the East/West link road and a further two for development of the business area, It was also noted that the taking in house of the car parking is working well, with plans for further extensions to this facility being considered.

A question from the floor relating to some passengers entering/exiting the airport to avoid the £3 per fee was being addressed and what the local authority was doing about vehicles stopping on the main road to discharge/collect these people.

The response was that the airport was looking into future plans relating to this but could not be involved with the area outside its control ie. The main road.

Item 8 Introduced Keith Jewitt, Acting Fire Services Manager, Who gave a short talk on the equipment and methods of dealing with Fire and Related incidents within the Airport.
